Staff and students have been getting sick, and you may have noticed the number of relief teachers we are drawing upon at the moment. ## **PARENT VOLUNTEERS**

### IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR PARENT VOLUNTEERS

From 1 July 2023 reforms to strengthen Working with Children (WWC) checks have come into effect. These changes are to help better protect our children by making it harder for people who have committed certain offences to obtain a WWC Card.

This means that before a parent can volunteer at school or be a helper in class, you will need to complete a 'Parent and child volunteer declaration form' giving details of your WWC check OR, if you do not have a WWC, a declaration stating that you do not have a current working with children negative notice or interim negative notice.

This Declaration will need to be filled in annually if you wish to continue volunteering at the school. This declaration only applies to legal guardians and family members under 18 who volunteer at school. Any other family member who wishes to volunteer at the school will require a working with children's card, e.g. grandparents. Please see attached fact sheet for more information.

Next time you sign in at the office to volunteer, the office staff will provide you with a declaration to fill out and sign. We will keep this declaration on record for the next year.

Thank you to all the wonderful parents that volunteer at BCPS, we are very grateful for everything that you do to help our children grow and keep them safe.

#### Virtue of the fortnight: HONESTY

#### **Behaviour Education at BCPS**

Every Monday, students attend a 'Behaviour Education Assembly'. Students also work with our Behaviour Education specialists.

This fortnight, students will be learning about:

Social management involves students interacting with a range of people effectively and respectfully, and developing skills like teamwork, communication, leadership, and conflict resolution. These skills help students build positive relationships and participate in social activities.

# In Week 4, students at Bannister Creek will be visited by St Johns for First Aid!

St John WA provides First Aid Focus, a free in-school \_ program that allows WA students to learn basic first aid skills.

The experienced Community Education Officers demonstrate the correct first aid approach, as well as students having the opportunity to practice and rehearse these life-saving skills.

**K-PP Incursion:** Through a storybook and with the aid of Kura the Bear, children will see how to identify an emergency, what number to call in an emergency and understand the role of who can help in an emergency.


**Year 1-2 Incursion:** Students will learn how to recognise a DANGER, how to get someone to RESPOND accordingly and when and how to SEND for help in an emergency. Students will understand what an emergency is and how to recognise an ambulance and a paramedic.

**Year 3-4 Incursion:** This session is designed to provide opportunities to identify, practise and develop the student's skills. The focus for the students will be able to assess the casualty's condition, check airways and breathing and how to place the casualty into the recovery position.

Year 5-6 Incursion: Students will experience First Aid scenarios in Virtual Reality! Guided by the innovative Medical Information Assistant (MIA) and the St John action plan, they'll put their skills to the test in a thrilling, realistic virtual environment.


