SUSTAINABILITY CORNER

Natural Garden Pest Remedies

Horticultural oil - This controls most insect pests, including scale, aphids, white fly, leaf miner, mealy bug and mites.

2 cups of vegetable oil + $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of dishwashing detergent.

Shake together in a jar, where the mixture will turn a milky colour. Add 2 tablespoons of this concentrate to a litre of water and it's ready to spray.

Coffee - kills slugs and snails.

Add to 10 parts water, one part espresso coffee (not instant). Spray over the surface of leaves and soil where snails and slugs might crawl. Reapply after heavy rain.

VACSWIM CLASSES


VacSwim Swimming Lessons

BEDWETTING

Bedwetting, or nocturnal enuresis, is very common in children. Bedwetting has nothing to do with dreaming, and children who wet the bed are not "just lazy".

If your child wets the bed, there are a number of things you can do to help, such as using a waterproof mattress cover and establishing a before-bed toilet routine. It is not helpful to punish children who wet the bed. Fluids should not be restricted, even before bedtime. Sugary or caffeinated drinks should be avoided.

If your child is still wetting the bed after five and a half years of age, seek help through a referral by your local doctor. A bedwetting alarm is an effective and safe method of treatment available for nocturnal enuresis and may be appropriate for your child.


