On **Tuesday 9 May 2023**, Bannister Creek Primary School will close at **11:30am** for Parent/Teacher interviews. Please note this date on your calendar.

Teachers will conduct interviews from 12:00 to 5:00pm. All interviews will be held in classrooms or specialist areas, except for Kindy Room 2 Yellow Group (Mrs Wiley) which will be held in the Conference Room. Interviews will be timed for 12 minute discussion times, with 3 minute changeovers. If parents are unable to attend this session, or more in-depth discussion is required, an alternative meeting date needs to be arranged with teachers.

All children need to be collected from school at 11:30am on this day as teachers will be in meetings and therefore not able to provide supervision or duty of care. Our onsite out of school care provider, Camp Australia, will be operating from 11:30am, providing activities for children enrolled in their program.

Virtue of the fortnight - EMPATHY

Empathy is understanding how someone else feels by putting yourself in their shoes. It helps us be kind and caring to others. It's an important skill for building strong relationships.

Behaviour Education at BCPS

Every Monday, students attend a 'Behaviour Education Assembly'. Students also work in small groups with our Behaviour Education specialists. This fortnight, students will be learning about:



<u>Social Awareness</u> focuses on students understanding and supporting others by recognizing their feelings and perspectives, participating in positive and respectful relationships, and gaining an understanding of advocacy. It teaches students to show respect for others and to be aware of the role of advocacy in society.

Our focus in the Behaviour Education Assemblies this term will be road safety, bullying, cyber bullying, and online safety.



In Week 3, our students will be visited by Constable Care!

Students in Years 1 and 2 will be watch a performance called 'Getting to School' where they will learn all about walking, riding a bike or scooter, and travelling in the car safely.



Students in Years 3 to 6 will watch a performance called 'Trending'. This show uses two short scenarios to explore the potential dangers of social media for young people. Helping them to understand the importance of online respect and consent, as well as the consequences of trolling, online abuse and sending private pictures. Through the interactive playbacks and discussions, students are able to practice prosocial skills and collaborate to solve challenging predicaments facing young people today.
