

#### **Behaviour Education at BCPS**

## This week, students were visited by Constable Care!

Students in Years 1 and 2 watched a performance called 'Getting to School' where they learnt all about walking, riding a bike or scooter, and travelling in the car safely.



## CONSTABLE CARE'S TOP TIPS FOR GETTING TO SCHOOL SAFELY:

- Before crossing the road, I should always stop, look and listen for cars.
- I should always check my bike's tyres and brakes before I go for a ride.
- . I always need to wear my helmet when riding my bike.
- Every driver needs to obey the 40km per hour School Zone sign.
- When travelling in a car, I always need to wear my seatbelt and sit quietly so I don't distract the driver.

Students in Years 3 to 6 watched a performance called 'Trending'. This show used two short scenarios to explore the potential dangers of social media for young people. Some of the key concepts the students learnt about were:

- **Empathy** The ability to feel with someone else. Through the ability to understand how someone else is feeling and connect personally with those emotions, you can develop a compassionate helping behaviour. The ability to practice empathy within an online context can be more challenging with so many cues we read when face to face with someone being removed.
- **Respect** Within an online community, students must develop an understanding of how to show respect to the many different people they may interact with. Through seeing online platforms as spaces designed for everyone, students need to develop respectful behaviours and the capacity to recognise disrespectful actions.
- Online Safety The digital world provides so many wonderful opportunities for students, but just like the physical world, contains some risks. Through analysing and understanding these potential risks, students can develop a toolkit of strategies to mitigate and avoid these potential dangers.
- **Information Spreading Online** Central to Trending is the risk that exists for photos, videos and personal information to spread online very quickly. It is essential for students to develop a clear understanding of the risk that exists each time they share information online.
